Exception for Single Family Fire Sprinkler Systems

In the event that a new single family customer requests a meter up-sizing to support a fire sprinkler system for a residence, then the customer will be required to pay for the cost of the meter to be installed, and also will be required to pay connection charges and AGRF fees based upon the meter size that would have been required absent the fire sprinkler system. The customer will be required to pay base facility charges based on the size of meter installed. The customer must also install a reduced pressure back-flow prevention device on the fire sprinkler line. The back-flow prevention device shall be registered with the utility. The customer will be required to perform annual inspections of the back-flow prevention device and provide certified inspection reports to the utility.

ACCRUED GUARANTEED REVENUE FEE

Applicable to all customers of the utility system at the time of connection.

CONNECTION CHARGES FOR ALL CUSTOMERS

The Water Connection Charges are as follows:

Single-family and multi-family customers with individual meters – \$1,800 per equivalent residential connection (defined as 250 gallons per day domestic and 350 per day irrigation average daily flow) times the number of equivalent residential connections of demand as determined by the Town of Jupiter Island’s consulting engineer in accordance with standard design flow criteria for residential potable and irrigation use.

Multi-family and mobile home park master meter customers – \$1,260 times the number of units behind the meter.

General Service, commercial, industrial, and mixed use master meter customers – \$1,800 per equivalent residential connection times the number of equivalent residential connections of demand as determined by the Town of Jupiter Island’s consulting engineer in accordance with standard design flow criteria for general service potable and irrigation use.

The Wastewater Connection Charges are as follows:

Single-family customers and multi-family customers with individual meters – \$2,610 per equivalent residential connection (defined as 250 gallons per day average daily flow) times the number of equivalent residential connections of demand as determined by the Town of Jupiter Island’s consulting engineer in accordance with standard design flow criteria for residential potable and irrigation use.

Multi-family customers and mobile home park master meter customers – \$1,830 times the number of units behind the meter.

General Service, commercial, industrial, and mixed use master meter customers – \$2,610 per equivalent residential connection times the number of equivalent residential connections of demand as determined by the Town of Jupiter Island’s consulting engineer in accordance with standard design flow criteria for general service potable and irrigation use.

AUTOMATIC COST ESCALATION AND UTILITY COST PASS-THROUGH CHARGES

Automatic Cost Escalation

The Town of Jupiter Island South Martin Regional Utility system rates, fees and charges shall be automatically increased without further action of the Town of Jupiter Island Commission based upon the application of the Florida Public Service Commission utility price indices, as established from time to time by the Florida Public Service Commission pursuant to Florida Statute section 367.081(4)(a), as amended, to the then existing rates, fees and charges of the utility system. Upon application of this automatic cost escalation provision, the Town Manager shall submit to the Town Commission a report detailing the amount of the escalation and the new rates as revised. The utility's rates, fees, and charges tariff shall be adjusted pursuant to this section as required.

Utility Cost Pass-Through

The Town of Jupiter Island South Martin Regional Utility system rates, fees and charges shall be automatically increased without further action of the Town of Jupiter Island Commission based upon the implementation of a rate increase to the Town of Jupiter Island utility system by any utility which provides utility service to the Town of Jupiter Island Utility System, or upon implementation or increase of any taxes levied by a governmental authority against the Town of Jupiter Island Utility System, or upon an increase of costs incurred for water quality or wastewater quality testing required by the Department of Environmental Protection, or other unfunded mandates imposed by a controlling governmental agency. Upon application of this cost pass-through provision, the Town Manager shall submit to the Town Commission a report detailing the amount of the escalation and the new rates as revised. The utility's rates, fees, and charges tariff shall be adjusted pursuant to this section as required.

Water Use Restriction Surcharge

Pursuant to Resolution No. 573 adopted September 20, 2007, commodity charges may be adjusted from time to time to reflect a water use restriction surcharge rate adjustment that may be implemented in response to general water use restrictions imposed by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD).
